

It is the responsibility of the homeowner to regularly test w ater quality, maintain the w ater system, and address any problems. Affordable, confidential w ater testing and education will be offered through many Virginia Cooperative Extension offices. To find out w ho to contact for your locality, visit http://www.wellwater.bse.vt.edu/events.php.

Water samples collected by participating homeowners will be analyzed for 14 parameters, including bacteria, metals, nitrate and hardness at a cost of \$55. Results and water system care and maintenance information will be shared at an information meeting. All information is kept strictly confidential and results are reported only to the homeowner.
