Denise Gammon– Education programs are in full swing including summer camps in Richmond and Goochland. Other camps have been planned. Denise has created 10 videos on YouTube with summer reading and craft opportunities for kids and will share those links.

Lorne Field – The Pocoshock creek stream restoration project is approximately 50% complete. Progress is slower on the Falling Creek project dredging. Lorne will be starting some in-person rain barrel workshops in October. He is also doing a lot of social media outreach and video production aimed at household hazardous waste. Betty McCracken – The new fiscal year has brought with it a tremendous cost-share workload. For FY21, Monacan SWCD disbursed 90% of their cost-share funds, which is required by the DCR grant agreement. They will be hiring a new conservation specialist (4th FT staff member). Betty will set up at the Manakin Farmers Market on July 31 with general info about SWCD programs and provide children's activities.

Kathleen Ogilvy – DOF and VASWCD have combined their conservation camps into one event called the VA Natural Resources Academy. It is a virtual camp that is taking place right now. DOF is working hard to try and meet the James River Buffer goals. Kathleen announced that numerous DOF positions are currently available. Many of the DOF staff are being sent out west to fight forest fires.

Sharon Conner – Hanover-Caroline SWCD also had a huge cost-share year with approximately \$2 million disbursed. The District had a successful conservation kick-off event at the Meadow Event Park last week with approximately 100 in attendance including Deputy Secretary of Natural Resources Ann Jennings. Their education specialist has held several workshops to make rain barrels and vermi-compost bins.

Olivia Hall – There have been quite a number of sanitary sewer breaks and clean up in Henrico with one being in a private community. The Cobb Creek Reservoir construction is going on in Cumberland County. It is a Reservoir for Henrico water. Olivia suggested possibly setting up a kayak trip once construction has been completed in 2023.

	Jennifer Clarke – Richmond working on its combined sewer systems. Richmond has an interim plan with \$33.3 million slated for 10 quicker projects, with the long-term plan and solution (over the next 14 years) costing an estimated \$850 million. Richmond is seeking American Rescue Plan funding so as not to push the burden onto ratepayers, 23.2% of which are below the poverty line.		
	Lindy Durham – Emailed report - Henricopolis joins the VASWCD in recognizing our Youth Conservation Leadership students. We had 3 this year including Max Friedlander, Hina Myamoto and Jayson Gray. We're providing programs for Camp Henrico at 6 locations. We are also participating in the Dorey Park Farmers' Market. The annual conservation poster contest is coming up soon. This is one of our signature programs. Teachers are already requesting staff time for it! Yay!
