Baby Sturgeon Count Skyrockets in James River (Chesapeake Bay Magazine)



There's cause for celebration among those working to restore the James River. An unprecedented nearly 150 baby sturgeon have been found in the river this fall.

Just two weeks ago, Bay Bulletin reported that riverkeepers were excited to find five babies of the endangered species. Now, researchers have counted 30 times that many- and it's becoming clear that it's a "bumper year" for sturgeon spawning.

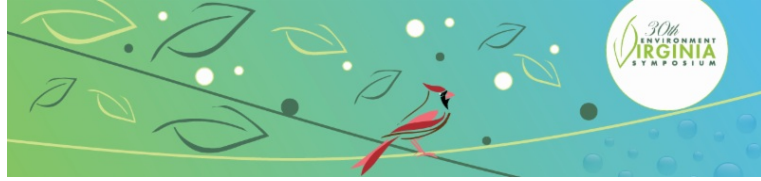
Partners (EIP).
