### In The News

#### Sign Proclaims Cleaner Water in Western Powhatan (MJRT, Monacan SWCD)



There is a new sign at a cattle farm in western Powhatan. Its owner has proudly worked for nine years to fence out 150 cattle from all the streams flowing through the property.

The sign was purchased with a grant through the Middle James Roundtable. It was installed in partnership with Monacan Soil and Water Conservation District by staff member Betty McCracken.

Cattle on this farm are excluded from 5.6 miles of streambanks on over 325 acres of pasture. A 35 foot buffer is required through a practice within the Va. Agricultural Cost Share Program, which is administered by Monacan Soil and Water Conservation District. More than 46 acres of buffer were created between the fence and the streambank. This buffer area has become revegetated and benefits wildlife, controls erosion, and absorbs nutrient runoff from the pastures.

This is the 3rd sign installed in western Powhatan. The signs are an example of how the Roundtable and the District are promoting positive strides made by our local farmers to improve water quality.
